



What to expect in High School:

- **Daily Engagement:** Work on each course every school day to stay on track.
- **Complete Weekly Assignments:** Complete all lessons and assignments as outlined in the course module.
- **Weekly Submission Deadline:** Turn in all assignments by 11:59 p.m. on Friday.



Components of Each High School Course

Curriculum Provider	The student uses curriculum to study the course. <i>Examples of providers include: Power Homeschool, Edmentum, HMH Collections, Teaching Textbook, etc.</i>
Canvas	Canvas is the Learning Management System (LMS) is where students use modules to find and submit assignments, while each course provides access to syllabi and Subject Area Specialist (SAS) contact information.
Educational Coach (EC)	Serves as a mentor, meeting with students weekly to provide guidance, encouragement, and help them stay on track with coursework.
Subject Area Specialist (SAS)	Licensed teachers who lead in-person Bridge classes on campus and assess student work in their subject area. They also support students using the curriculum at home or in the community and work alongside Curriculum Specialists to develop high-quality, remote curriculum.
Parent Liaison (PL)	K-12 staff members who assists families with curriculum orders, technology check-outs, program orientation, and parent support.

How to work on High School Courses:

1. Read each course syllabus located in your Canvas courses.
2. Go to the Canvas dashboard and select the course you're working on.
3. Locate the appropriate course module for the week.
4. Read through the module to see what lessons and assignments you need to complete.
5. Go to your curriculum provider (e.g., Power Homeschool, Edmentum, HMH Collections, Teaching Textbooks, etc.) to complete the lessons listed in the Canvas module.
6. Return to Canvas to complete and submit your assignments.

High School Requirements At-A-Glance:

Daily: Attendance, at-home lessons, and communication with SAS and EC as needed.

Weekly: Submit assignments, attend on-campus classes, meet with EC, and review weekly emails.

Yearly: Develop Planned Course of Study (PCS), complete Growth Projects, and state testing.
